Speaker Biographies

James S. Blumenstock

Jim Blumenstock holds the position of Chief Program Officer for Public Health Practice for the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials (ASTHO). His portfolio includes the state public health practice program areas of infectious and emerging diseases, immunization, environmental health, and public health preparedness and security, including pandemic influenza preparedness. Jim also serves as a member of the Association's Executive Management Team responsible for enterprise-wide strategic planning, administrative services, member support, and public health advocacy.

Prior to his arrival at ASTHO on November 1, 2005, Jim was the Deputy Commissioner of Health for the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services where he retired after almost 32 years of career public health service. In this capacity, he had executive oversight responsibilities for a department branch of over 650 staff, an operating budget of approximately \$125 million, which was comprised of the Division of Public Health and Environmental Laboratories; Division of Epidemiology, Occupational and Environmental Health; Division of Local Health Practice and Regional Systems Development; Division of Health Emergency Preparedness and Response, and the Office of Animal Welfare. During his tenure, Jim also represented the Department on a number of boards, councils and commissions including the NJ Domestic Security Preparedness Task Force.

Jim is the proud recipient of the ASTHO 2004 Noble J. Swearingen Award for excellence in public health administration and the Dennis J. Sullivan award, the highest honor bestowed by the NJ Public Health Association for dedicated and outstanding service and contribution to the cause of public health. He is also a Year 14 Scholar of the Public Health Leadership Institute and held an elected office serving his community for 12 years.

Jim received his Bachelor of Science degree in Environmental Science from Rutgers University in 1973 and a Master of Arts degree in Health Sciences Administration from Jersey City State College in 1977. He is a native of New Jersey which is still his primary residence with his wife of 35 years, Lee. They have three children and two (beautiful) granddaughters.

Steven M. Crimando, MA, BCETS

Steven M. Crimando, MA, BCETS, is an internationally known consultant and trainer specialized in the behavioral aspects of emergency management, homeland security and business continuity. He is the Director of Training for the Disaster & Terrorism Branch in the NJ Division of Mental Health Services. Steve is a Board Certified Expert in Traumatic Stress (BCETS) and Diplomate of the American Academy of Experts in Traumatic Stress. He is the Vice Chair of the Forensic Counseling Division for the American College of Forensic Examiners International.

Steve served as a Disaster Field Operations Supervisor for the FEMA-funded mental health response to the 9/11 WTC attacks and coordinated onsite psychological services at New Jersey's anthrax screening center. He helped coordinate crisis response efforts at such incidents as the 1993 World Trade Center bombing, Edison (NJ) Gas Line Explosion, and TWA Flight 800 crash. Steve has assisted at over a dozen major air crashes and has counseled many victims of violence, including those who were targets of the Unabomber and other acts of terrorism. He has served as a consultant and trainer for the U.S. Department of Justice; the Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration's Disaster Technical Assistance Center (SAMHSA-DTAC); Department of Homeland Security (DHS); Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA); U.S. Public Health Service; and the United Nations.

Steve is a certified law enforcement instructor, and a mental health specialist with several police trauma teams.

Steve is the author of many published articles and book chapters. He has developed human factors-oriented crisis management programs for government agencies and multinational corporations. He has been featured for his work in crisis prevention and response in the New York Times, and has appeared on both network and cable news and talk shows, as well as in the courts as a subject matter expert addressing public and private sector crisis prevention and response. Paul Etkind, DrPH, MPH

Paul Etkind joined NACCHO in April of 2009 and serves as the Senior Analyst for Immunizations. As such, Paul has range of responsibilities related to immunization and related vaccine-preventable disease epidemiology, including: policy analysis; program design; research and evaluation; writing for publication; technical assistance; communication of learnings to the field; program and budget management; and project promotion. As a member of the Community Health Team, he also serves as a resource to infectious disease prevention and control, HIV/STI, maternal and child health, epidemiology, and adolescent health project activities.

Paul has worked in public health practice since the late 1970's. In that time, he has served as an epidemiologist and program manager in the epidemiology, immunization and STI prevention programs of the Massachusetts Department of Public Health. More recently, he served as the Deputy Director and Epidemiologist for the

Department of Health and Community Services of the City of Nashua, NH. While there, he was also the primary person for public health preparedness planning and training.

Paul has a BA in Biology from Clark University, and an MPH and DrPH from Yale University's School of Epidemiology and Public Health.

David Gruber

David Gruber received his B.A. in Microbiology from Rutgers University and his Masters in Strategy from the U.S. Army Command and General Officer Staff College. He spent twenty-one years in the U.S. Navy serving as Pilot, Intelligence Officer, and, Chemical/Biological Warfare specialist. After retiring from the Navy, he was the Senior Planner for the Dallas County Health Department, Dallas, TX. Mr. Gruber is now the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services Senior Assistant Commissioner for the Division of Health Infrastructure Preparedness and Emergency Response, the Office of Emergency Medical Services and the Division of Public Health and Environmental Laboratories.

Heather Howard

On November 29, 2007, Governor Jon S. Corzine nominated Heather Howard to be the 14th Commissioner of the Department of Health and Senior Services. She was confirmed as Commissioner by the Senate on January 8, 2008.

As Health and Senior Services Commissioner, Howard has been a strong advocate for maternal and child health, with a particular focus on prenatal care. Shortly after becoming Commissioner, she appointed a task force to examine ways to improve the delivery of prenatal

care in New Jersey. One key finding was the need to raise public awareness about the importance of early prenatal care, and of women maintaining their health before, during and between pregnancies. The Commissioner has traveled the state speaking on these issues, and collaborates with the provider community to improve birth outcomes.

Commissioner Howard, who is an attorney, has also worked to strengthen the state's hospital system and to improve quality of care. She has expanded health care access by expanding New Jersey's network of community health centers that serve the uninsured and underserved.

She has received a number of awards for her leadership and advocacy, including the F.D.R Visionary Award from the March of Dimes New Jersey Chapter. She has been honored for health advocacy for women by the New Jersey Primary Care Association, and honored by New Jersey Citizen Action at its annual awards ceremony.

Commissioner Howard came to the post with 15 years of policy experience at the state and federal levels. She served as Governor's Corzine's Policy Counsel, advising on all policy issues – including NJ FamilyCare, the state's health insurance program for low-income children and families -- and directing the policy staff. From 2001 to 2006, Howard worked in Washington, D.C., for then-Senator Corzine. She served as Legislative Counsel, Deputy Chief of Staff for Policy and Planning, and finally as Chief of Staff. Howard advised the Senator on policy development, legislative strategy, constituent services, communications and personnel.

Before joining the Corzine staff, Howard worked in the White House where she served as Associate Director of President Bill Clinton's Domestic Policy Council, and Senior Policy Adviser to First Lady Hillary Clinton.

Howard earned her J.D. cum laude from New York University School of Law. She served a judicial clerkship with Judge Martha Craig Daughtrey of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit. Howard was then accepted into the U.S. Department of Justice's Honors Program, where she worked as a trial attorney in the Antitrust Division's Health Care Task Force.

From 1990 to 1994, she was legislative assistant and policy adviser to Congresswoman Nita Lowey of New York.

Howard earned a B.A. cum laude in History and Spanish from Duke University. She lives in Princeton with her husband and son.

Gladys Padro, M.S.W., LSW

Gladys Padro has served the New Jersey Department of Human Services for thirty one years. She has dedicated nineteen years to her work as New Jersey's Mental Health Disaster Coordinator and in this capacity she is also the Director of the Division of Mental Health Service's Disaster and Terrorism Branch. As Branch Director, she manages a team of professionals providing technical assistance and training to mental health providers focused on all hazards planning and preparedness. Through the Branch, the state has developed a process for certifying its mental health workforce to provide counseling services for people affected by disasters.

Ms. Padro has provided assistance with numerous traumatic events including: tropical storms; a pipeline explosion; the bombing of the World Trade Center in the early nineties; airplane crashes; deaths involving state employees; incidents involving school age children and college age young adults; assistance for refugees from Kosovo and Americans fleeing Lebanon.

She was responsible for grants management of crisis counseling programs developed in response to the World Trade Center disaster and directed a program called Project Phoenix developed to provide crisis counseling and clinical mental health services to people directly affected by 9/11 as well as to the general public. The program was the longest of its kind in the state's history, lasting for three years following the disaster. Ms. Padro also directed a crisis counseling program for Hurricane Katrina evacuees who relocated in New Jersey.

The state has won several video awards as result of her efforts including "Telly" and "Communicator" awards for videos depicting the mental health responses to Tropical Storm Floyd and the September 11 disasters respectively.

In collaboration with the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services, she developed an influenza pandemic plan for the provision of mental health services.

Susan Walsh, MD, FACP

Susan Walsh, MD, FACP is an internist and serves as the Deputy Commissioner for the Public Health Services Branch in the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services.

Dr. Walsh joined the Department in December of 2008, and in her role as Deputy Commissioner, oversees the Divisions of HIV/AIDS Services, Family Health Services, Epidemiology, Environmental and Occupational Health Services, as well as the Office of the State Epidemiologist.

Dr. Walsh earned her medical degree from the University of Medicine and Dentistry-New Jersey Medical School and completed her residency at University Hospital in Newark. As a National Health Service Scholar, she began her core years

as a clinician at a federally qualified health center and finished her community work as the center's Vice President/Chief Medical Officer. This position included oversight of a large academic health center with practice sites in three counties including residency continuity clinics from three academic programs.

Prior to joining the Department of Health and Senior Services, Dr. Walsh had a long service career in primary care and public health. As a Board member of Clinical Directors Network, a peer support and research institution based in Manhattan, Dr. Walsh was instrumental in bringing clinical research initiatives to the community level, enabling underserved and minority communities to participate in clinical trials with a focus on maximizing health with minimal resources.

Most recently, Dr. Walsh served as co-medical director of the state-wide asthma collaborative which trained clinicians and support staff from seventeen community health centers in the federal care model to reduce health disparities. She is a member of the Association for Prevention Teaching and Research.

Pascale Wortley, MD, MPH

Dr. Pascale Wortley is the chief of the Health Services Research and Evaluation Branch in the Immunization Services Division. She is a graduate of the University of Washington School of Medicine, and received training in public health and preventive medicine at the University of Washington. She completed CDC's Epidemic Intelligence Service and has worked at CDC for 17 years in several different programs, including HIV/AIDS Surveillance, Tobacco Control, and currently in Immunization Services. She is responsible for directing research related to uptake of immunization across the life span, including

identifying effective interventions, determining factors that promote the implementation of such interventions, developing approaches to overcoming barriers to vaccination in various populations, assessing impact of interventions, policies, and economic factors. In addition, she

has been involved in pandemic influenza planning since 2003 with a focus on state and local preparedness. She is currently is serving as the lead for the Implementation Team for the H1N1 Vaccine Task Force.
